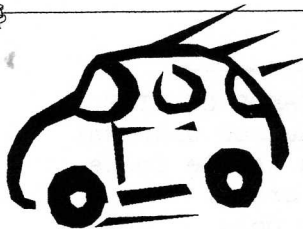
Library Collections: The Society does not maintain its own library. Instead we contribute towards the collection of the Monterey Family History Center (see below), where we meet.

Dating Tombstones

(This was sent to the Internet discussion list SUL-LIVAN-L at rootsweb.com, but it originated somewhere else, so the author is not known.)

One way to help find the era your ancestor was buried is to examine the material from which the tombstone is made. If your ancestor has a stone made of slate or common fieldstone (except wood used by pioneers), chances are the stone dates from 1796-1830.

* If the stone is flat-topped hard marble, dates are about 1830-1849.

* If the "mystery" stone is round or pointed soft marble with cursive inscriptions, look for a date of 1845-1868.

* Masonic four-sided stones began in 1850 and are still in use today.

* Pylons, columns and all exotic-style monuments are usually dated 1860-1900.

* Zinc monuments date from 1870-1900.

* Granite, now common, came into use about 1900.

If the writing is too faded to read, use a 75 watt black light bulb in any lamp that casts light directly on the written message. The writing will miraculously appear.

THEY FOLLOWED SERRA**Gary Carlsen****SANTA RITA**

Once an independent unincorporated settlement Santa Rita is currently a growing neighborhood in the northern section of Salinas. Originally it was laid out and dedicated for public use by Jose Manuel Soto in 1867. It is believed Jose Manuel arrived from Peru in 1849, and purchased Rancho Los Gatos or Santa Rita in 1860.

Jose Manuel Soto was the first postmaster of the Santa Rita Post Office, which was approved January 20 1870, as the New Republic Post Office, and changed to Santa Rita June 3rd 1874. When rural free delivery was established to the area from the Salinas Post Office, it ceased operation July 31 1908.

The 1889 San Jose City Directory for Santa Clara, San Mateo, Santa Cruz, San Benito, and Monterey Counties, listed the following residents of Santa Rita:

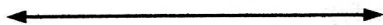


Yes, we have a rudimentary web page at <http://www.familyhistory.com/societyhall/viewmember.asp?societyid=480>.

MoCoGenSo 50/50 Program

The goal of the 50/50 Program is to encourage purchase of books and CD-ROMs for the library of the Family History Center, and to leverage the MoCoGenSo book budget by soliciting sponsors from our membership to share in the expense of such purchases.
